To Whom It May Concern:

This letter addresses my experiences and those of our development team while working with the staff of DataLOGIC over a span of approximately ten years.

From 1999 through 2005, DataLOGIC served as the sole contractor responsible for the design and development of a national corporate database for wildlife resources, initially called Fauna, now called Wildlife. Fauna was the first national spatial-relational database for the Forest Service, with a GIS spatial component linked with an Oracle database. Users of the application are able to record survey data collected for specific field protocols, reflecting complex data relationships.

From 2005 through 2009, DataLOGIC provided several services for our team. They designed and implemented a user interface to support the national TES protocol for the northern goshawk, a bioregional population monitoring protocol. They also provided support for data migration of spatial and tabular data, from legacy datasets, state heritage Biotics databases, and from the Bureau of Land Management's GeObob wildlife database. They developed numerous tools for use by our helpdesk personnel to assist users in mass data correction, including GIS projection adjustments, and provided technical user assistance when our helpdesk personnel were unable to address an issue.

Throughout these projects, DataLOGIC consistently provided us with quality work. They met all contract specifications, and stayed within budget. They were exceptional at translating user requirements into well-received products and they worked well under tight deadlines. I found every one of their staff members to be highly professional and easy to work with. I would not hesitate to hire them in the future.
